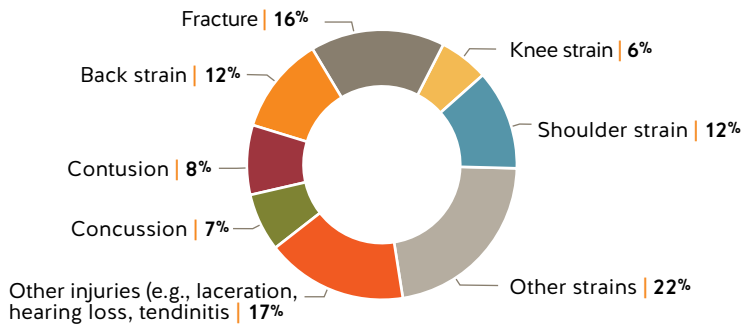

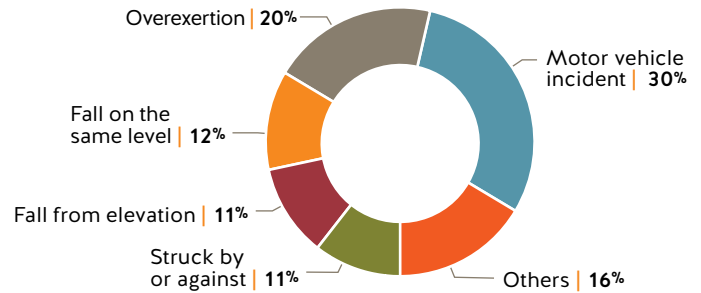

Time-loss claims 2014–2018

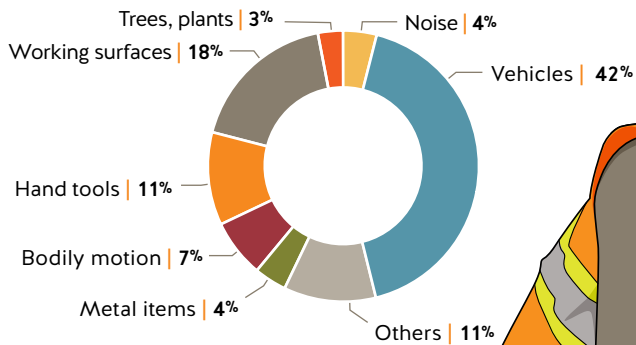
Nature of injury

Source of injury



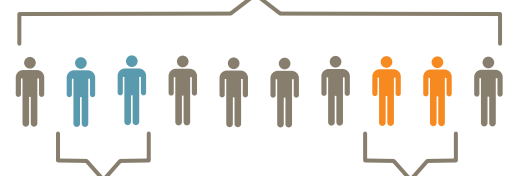
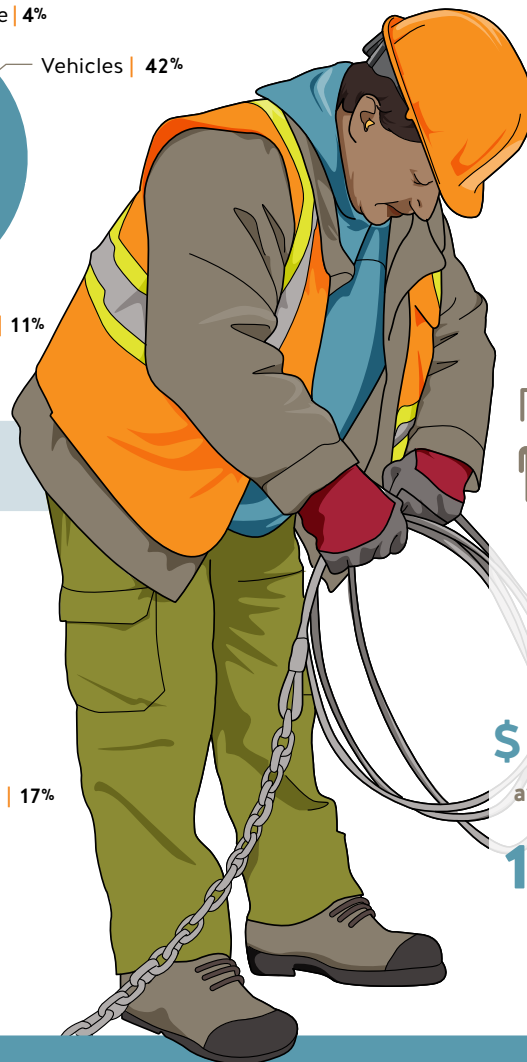
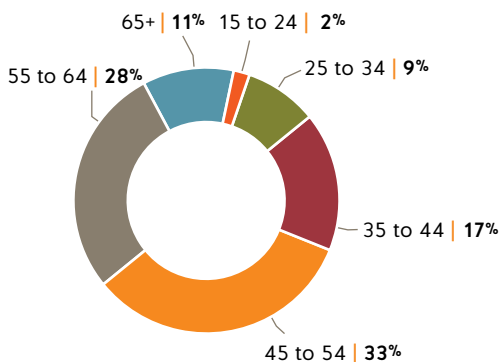

Incident description

	Claim cost	Work days lost
A worker was driving a loaded logging truck on a resource road down an icy steep grade. The driver lost control and the truck rolled onto its side. The truck continued sliding down the road before eventually coming to a stop, resulting in serious injuries to the worker.	\$902,931	474
A worker was standing on a log transporter trailer pulling down stake extensions. The worker slipped and fell awkwardly to the ground, resulting in a serious leg injury.	\$524,328	458
A logging truck driver sustained multiple head and lower body injuries after attempting to make a gradual turn on a highway in black ice conditions. The truck did not respond to the turn, slid off the highway and rolled over into the ditch.	\$415,114	224
While walking around a logging truck during a daily inspection, a worker slipped and fell on the icy ground resulting in a serious fracture to a lower body part.	\$114,663	476
The repetitive motion of throwing cable wrappers over loads of logs resulted in a worker overexerting and injuring a shoulder.	\$69,248	253
A worker was tightening load wrappers when a log shifted in the load causing the load binder to move abruptly. The force of this movement injured the worker's shoulder.	\$65,021	202

- 1 Serious injury claims:** The number of time-loss claims that represent either a serious medical diagnosis, or a potentially-serious medical diagnosis with a long recovery period of 50+ days paid (10+ weeks off work). Includes all work-related death claims.
- 2 Long-recovery sprains and strains:** The number of short-term or long-term disability claims that represent a sprain, strain, carpal tunnel or rheumatism medical diagnosis with a long recovery period (10+ weeks). Excludes work-related death claims.
